## Open Strategy #1

- Annual fund provided by Ministry of Advanced Education
- Issued via Request For Proposals (RFP) to public post secondary
- Five rounds 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 - \$6.25 million investment
- Online programs, courses, virtual labs, learning objects & technologies - Pro-D, co-created content
- Inter-institutional collaboration & partnerships

- ❖ 700+ BC educators with validated accounts

# OPDF Summary - First 4 Rounds

- ❁ 306 proposals seeking over \$20 million in funding
- ❁ 60-70% collaborative inter-institutional project proposals
- ❁ External partners e-learning private sector companies, non-profit organizations, hospitals, associations, First Nations, ...
- ❁ Award done by evaluation committee of 8 peers from system
- ❁ 80 proposals awarded grants totaling \$5 million
- ❁ All public post-secondary institutions received grants
- ❁ 261 courses, 44 course modules, 150 learning objects, 18 virtual labs & tools

# 2007 OPDF Proposals

- Received 40 proposals
- 24 of BC's 25 public post secondary's participated
- 87% of the proposals involve partnerships
- Proposals are seeking over \$2.9 million dollars (750K available)
- Proposals (27) in the courses and co-created content area are seeking \$1.95 million
- Proposals (15) in the pro-d area are seeking \$950,000
- 11 proposals selected for award by evaluation committee
